

CAROLYN LATTER

Carolyn was born in to one of the leading theatrical families in Newcastle. Her grandfather, Colin Chapman, founded the Newcastle Dramatic Art Club in 1938. In her early twenties Carolyn was the Artistic Director for the ENDAC Youth Theatre, which led to her love of directing. Carolyn started directing an annual 'Revue' each year when the theatre was 'dark', and continued on with shows such as: *Oklahoma!*, *Little Shop of Horrors, Me and My Girl, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, and *Guys and Dolls*, to name a few. Before leaving Newcastle, Carolyn took on the bigger shows at The Civic Theatre, one of Australia's premier regional theatres. She took community theatre back to the big stage, and directed *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *Les Misérables* and *Disney's Beauty and the Beast*. In 2007, Carolyn moved to Perth with her family, where she continued directing within the Perth community theatre companies, as well as continuing her love of performing.

Moving back to the East Coast in 2013, Carolyn took a break from theatre to raise her 2 children, and in 2018, she once again took to the stage with Phoenix Ensemble in their production of *Disney's Beauty and the Beast*. Since then she has performed in *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* (Phoenix Ensemble), *42nd Street* (Savoyards), and recently travelled to the Gold Coast to play a bucket list role of the Mother Abbess in *The Sound of Music*. Carolyn is thrilled to return to the creative side of this production, taking on the role of Director for *Curtains*.

It is with absolute delight that I return to the creative side of the stage to direct *Curtains* after a 13-year hiatus. This experience has been truly wonderful, especially with such a top-notch team by my side—Jake, Ange, and Mel. *Curtains* is an incredibly fun show, and from the very first read-through, the cast has brought an abundance of enthusiasm, excitement, and joy to every rehearsal. They are truly awesome. Thank you to the Savoyards committee for allowing me this opportunity.

As a director, the most important contribution one can make is to enrich the lives of the audience and actors, making their experiences more extraordinary, informed, and rewarding. I sincerely hope I have achieved this goal.

I extend my deepest gratitude to the small army of volunteers who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes, those dedicated to set design and construction, sound and lighting, costumes, wigs, hair and makeup, stage crew, front of house, and marketing. Your hard work does not go unnoticed.

Jacob Cavanough is an experienced musical director, percussionist and teacher with nearly 30 years of experience performing both on and under the stage. He holds a Bachelor of Music from QUT and directs successful percussion programs at two Brisbane schools. Jake is a highly sought-after musician, having performed in the orchestra for over 50 musical theatre productions with companies across Brisbane, enjoying roles on percussion, keyboard, trumpet, bass and as MD. He is the founding conductor and musical director of South of the River Community Band and is co-director of contemporary percussion ensemble Percussimo. Jake finds great joy in directing the unique 'Drum For Life' program with 'Here's to Life Redlands' and freelances regularly, conducting and playing with orchestras and ensembles around South-East Queensland and overseas.

He is partial to any musicals by Sondheim or Gilbert & Sullivan and has been known to tolerate Lloyd Webber for a fee. He has a passion for musical theatre with its power to tell stories and bring people together, and the unique buzz that each performance can give. Having been first welcomed into a Savoyards or the straight 22 years ago, Jake is very excited to be MD-ing a Savoyards show for the first time! He is thrilled to be part of the amazing creative team bringing *Curtains* to life with Savoyards.

I have found so much joy working on *Curtains* and bringing it to the stage with such a hardworking creative team, cast and crew. Having played in the pit for many Savoyards shows, I had often dreamed about taking up the baton as Musical Director. Unsure of whether these were actually dreams or nightmares, there was only one way to find out, so I jumped at the opportunity. Not without its challenges, *Curtains* is a greatly rewarding and delightful musical.

The heart of the show, its most enduring appeal, lies in its old-fashioned charm. It's a testament to the power of collaboration, with writers, singers and producers working

together to create something truly special.

The audience, in turn, finds themselves as part of this creative journey. I believe Kander and Ebb have tried successfully to mirror in the characters the same sense of awe and excitement that they must have experienced when writing the show. *Curtains* is driven by a wonderful score which I hope you will enjoy, from the rousing show-stopper 'Show People' to the darkly humorous 'The Woman's Dead' and the stirringly emotive 'I Miss The Music', a beautiful tribute by John Kander on the loss of his long-time writing partner Fred Ebb.

JACOB ALSO PLAYS SASHA ILJINSKY

Sasha comes from a long line of Balalaika players and had his first introduction to musical theatre when he took awrong turn backstage at his local theatre centre. Instead of heading up a folk music trio, he found himself playing in the pit for *Othelio*, a Shakespearian satire in three acts. The rest is history.

I want to acknowledge and commend







OPHELIA SOFTCAT


